2 4 Golf Scholarship	In 2007, Jack Wilson established the 2 4 Golf Scholarship Fund in memory of his late wife Emilie Wilson. Both were avid golfers who played almost daily. The license plate on their car read "2 4 Golf."
Andrews First Christian Church Memorial Scholarship	The Andrews First Christian Church Memorial Scholarship Fund was created in 2006 in memory of the Church's closing in October 2005.
Arley Morris H.O.P.E. Scholarship Brenda C. Bridge Memorial Scholarship	Jeanette Morris established this scholarship in memory of her husband, Arley Morris. The purpose of the scholarship is to provide support or H.O.P.E. (Helping Other People Excel) for students pursuing business careers and endeavors. The Brenda C. Bridge Memorial Scholarship was established in 2019 by Thomas Bridge in honor of his wife Brenda, who passed away in 2007. Brenda Bridge was a career educator who taught in the Huntington County Community School System and developed curriculum and programs for the advancement of teachers at the Region 8 Education Center.
Carl Repp Scholarship	The scholarship, funded anonymously to honor Carl Repp, is awarded to Huntington North graduates planning to attend Huntington University or current full-time Huntington University students. Carl Repp and his family ran grocery stores in Huntington when there used to be locally owned grocery stores throughout the town in varying neighborhoods. He also gave generously to non-profits and was a long-term Huntington resident.
Charles & Wilma (Sanger) Shuman Family Scholarship	Charles and Wilma Sanger Shuman were residents of Huntington County, and both farmed in southern Huntington and Wabash Counties. They also valued the importance of an education and created this scholarship for graduating Huntington North seniors and non-traditional students.
Chase Satterthwaite Memorial Scholarship	The Chase Satterthwaite Memorial Scholarship was established in 2020 by Chase's family and friends to commemorate his life. To honor Chase's love of animals and his constant willingness to help others, this scholarship is available to students entering the animal science or medical fields.

Citizens Telephone Scholarship	The Citizens Telephone Scholarship Fund was established in 2015 to provide financial support to Warren area (including Poneto, Liberty Center and Bluffton) students pursuing post-secondary education.
Daugherty Family Scholarship	The Daugherty Family Fund was established in 2009 in honor of H.L. and Martha Daugherty to provide scholarships to employees, their children, or Warren area students pursuing further education in an agriculture related course of study. The Daugherty Companies, founded in 1939, sold their manufacturing and distribution portion of the business in 2019 to Ag Express Electronics and the fund continues to support employees and children of Ag Express.
Dave Reeves Athletic Scholarship	Established in 2004 by Marsha Reeves, the Dave Reeves Athletic Scholarship was created "to celebrate Dave's love for the athletes he worked with over the years and to help a male or female thrower with educations costs."
David & Susan Brewer Family Scholarship	David and Susan Brewer established their family scholarship in 2019 to assist graduates of Huntington North High School to attend one of their preferred educational institutions including, Indiana University (Bloomington), DePauw University, Vincennes University and Huntington University.
Dean B. Stephan Memorial Scholarship	The daughters of Dean Stephan – Sally Morrison, Sandy Stephan, and Sheryl Baker – established a memorial scholarship to honor their father, who, amongst his many accomplishments, served 28- years as the longest-running principal at Lincoln Elementary School, and served over 57 years as the official scorekeeper for the Huntington Viking basketball team. The Dean B. Stephan Memorial Scholarship is awarded annually to a student who attended Lincoln Elementary School.
Delene Anne Regan Valedictorian Scholarship	In 2018 Dr. John Regan established the Delene Anne Regan Valedictorian Scholarship to honor the pursuit of academic excellence and the memory of Delene Anne Regan, valedictorian of the Huntington High School Class of 1953. She graduated from the IU School of Business with high honors and was a Kappa

	Kappa Gamma sorority member. Regan lost her 16-year battle with breast cancer in June 2016.
Donald E. & Lou Rayne Scheiber Catholic Education Scholarship	Created in 1997, the Donald E. & Lou Rayne Scheiber Catholic Education and Charity Fund accomplishes dual purposes. First, the fund promotes educational opportunities for Huntington County students who are members of one of three local Catholic Church parishes (Saint Joseph in Roanoke and Saint Mary and Saints Peter & Paul in Huntington). Second, the fund provides charitable grants to Catholic organizations who promote the accepted teachings of the Roman Catholic Church.
Dorothy M. Coll Scholarship	Mrs. Coll designated that a portion of her estate through a Charitable Remainder Trust be donated to HCCF to establish this scholarship in her name. Its recipients must be residents of Huntington County and full-time college students majoring in a science-related field.
Douglas & Virginia Ware Scholarship	The Douglas & Virginia Ware Scholarship was established by Mr. & Mrs. Ware in January 2023 to recognize outstanding students who exceed their peers in the following qualities (in random order): leadership, high character, academic excellence, community focus on giving back and helping others, demonstrated success in competitive athletes, definable achievements and work ethic, and a high level of achievement for self, family, and community. The Wares are long-term supporters of other Huntington County endeavors, but scholarships are deeply personal to them, as you can see by their mentor-type relationship with scholars and other scholarships they have supported such as the Robert. M "bob Straight memorial and Steve Platt Memorial Endowed Scholarships.
Dr. Jerry G. Solloway Family Scholarship	Sharon Solloway established this scholarship fund in 2007 in honor of her late husband and his dedication to be a life-long learner. Distributions are utilized to benefit graduating high school students from Huntington County.
Dr. John & Marjorie Hohe IFW Scholarship	Hohe, a retired dentist, and his wife, Marjorie, established the Dr. John Hohe & Marjorie Hohe IPFW Scholarship in 1999 to provide financial assistance to students attending IPFW. *Note: In 2018,

	IPFW officially became two separate universities namely Purdue University Fort Wayne and Indiana University Fort Wayne. They continue to share the same campus.
Dr. John & Marjorie Hohe PFW Scholarship	Hohe, a retired dentist, and his wife, Marjorie, established the Dr. John Hohe & Marjorie Hohe IPFW Scholarship in 1999 to provide financial assistance to students attending IPFW. *Note: In 2018, IPFW officially became two separate universities namely Purdue University Fort Wayne and Indiana University Fort Wayne. They continue to share the same campus.
Dr. John & Marjorie Hohe University of Saint Francis Scholarship	Dr. John Hohe, a retired dentist, and his wife, Marjorie, established the Dr. John & Marjorie Hohe Scholarship in 1999. The purpose of the scholarship is to provide financial assistance to students attending the University of St. Francis.
Ephraim (Mike) & Mary Cecil Scholarship	The Ephraim (Mike) & Mary Cecil Scholarship is awarded to a member of Trinity United Methodist Church who is pursuing an education in ministry of Christian faith or other Huntington County students pursuing careers in ministry of Christian faith.
Frank L. Pyle, Sr. Scholarship	Established by Ruby R. Pyle to serve as a tribute to the memory of her husband, Frank L. Pyle, to provide scholarships for residents of Huntington County pursuing a career in electronics.
Gary W. McCurley Scholarship	Ken and Dottie McCurley established this scholarship in memory of their son, Gary. The award is presented annually to a high school graduating senior or non-traditional student who exemplifies the high academic achievement and the same Christian values of Gary McCurley, a 1975 graduate of Huntington North.
George & Garnet Bergman Scholarship	The George & Garnet Bergman Scholarship was established in memory of this couple who called Warren home. Mr. Bergman continued his family's tradition of operating the Bergman Funeral Home that had been in the family for 100 years. The scholarship is for students from Huntington North, Southern Wells or Eastbrook High Schools.

Heith Garner Volunteer Scholarship	Donald and Angie Garner established this scholarship in memory of their son, Heith, an avid supporter of Huntington North athletics. Recipients are selected based on their record of volunteer activity during their teen years and demonstration of the character traits of enthusiasm and dedication.
Huntington Business Women's Scholarship	The Huntington Women's Business Women's Scholarship was established is 2021 by area business women to support women pursuing post-secondary and graduate degrees.
Huntington Firefighters Association Weston Close, Lucas Sunderman Scholarship	The Huntington Firefighters Association created this scholarship fund to sustain their current scholarship forever. Sons of Huntington Firefighters, Weston and Lucas passed away in separate car accidents in 2006.
Ignite Your Future Scholarship	This scholarship is funded by donations from the Don Wood Foundation. Don Wood believed in investing in the potential of traditional and nontraditional students pursuing fields related to entrepreneurship, leadership, sales and advanced manufacturing. He envisioned the Don Wood Foundation's role would be to serve as a vehicle for scholarships.
J. Edward & Polly Roush Scholarship	This scholarship fund was created in 1997 by a donation from Stanley Matheny and matched by the Lilly Endowment to honor his friends, J. Edward and Polly Roush and in honor of the centennial of Huntington College. Distributions are directed toward scholarships for Huntington County youth attending Huntington University.
Jackson P. Wright Memorial HNHS Music Scholarship Fund	The Jackson P. Wright Memorial HNHS Music Scholarship was established in 2023 by Sam and Brenda Wright to honor USMC Sgt. Jackson Payne Wright's remarkable life. While at HNHS, Jackson was an accomplished student at the honors level, all while balancing cross country and track along with band and his saxophone. The Jackson P. Wright HNHS Music Scholarship celebrates Jackson's competitive spirit, high academic achievement, and love of music.

Jeff Stonebraker Memorial Scholarship	The Jeff Stonebraker Memorial Scholarship, established in 2016, honors the son of Anne and Dean Stonebraker. Jeffrey was the Chief Public Defender of Clark County and actively participated in Clark County Drug Staffing Team, Juvenile Detention Alternatives Initiative Planning Team and the Indiana Bar Association and Indiana Public Defender Council. This scholarship is awarded to Huntington County residents attending Jeff's alma mater, Indiana University.
Jim & Nancy Breiner Family Scholarship	Jim & Nancy Breiner established the Breiner Scholarship. It is awarded to a Huntington North or Northfield High School graduate with priority going to an education major, although other majors will be considered.
Jim & Nancy Breiner Family University of St. Francis Scholarship	Jim and Nancy Breiner both graduated from the University of Saint Francis. They established this scholarship to help students attend the school that they enjoyed and that so enriched their lives.
Joseph H. Lesh Law Scholarship	William Lesh, J. Harold Lesh and Carolyn Mishler established this scholarship in honor and memory of their father, Joseph H. Lesh, who practiced law in Huntington County for many years prior to his death in 1989. The purpose of this scholarship is to support and encourage students who wish to pursue a career in the legal profession.
Kenneth W. Manes Memorial Scholarship	Established in 2010 by Kenny's wife, Sally, and children, Tony and Julie, to honor Kenny's belief in education as the means to better oneself, this scholarship is offered to United States Postal Service employees and their descendants in reverence to Kenny's love for his craft.
Kiwanis Club Scholarship	The Huntington Kiwanis Club set up several scholarships in honor of former and current Kiwanians to help Huntington County students pursue their post-secondary educational goals. Herman R. Goodin who operated an automobile dealership and died in World War II. Fred E. Winbrenner serving in leadership roles within the Kiwanis organization, starting more than 600 new Kiwanis club and recruiting new members. Robert L. Baker very active in local Kiwanis leadership for over 30 years. And Jerry

	Wayne Howard a Vietnam War veteran and worked as VP of Finance for Shuttleworth for 35 years.
Lancaster Elementary Art Scholarship	This scholarships is to reward a student interested in majoring in the Arts who also attended Lancaster Elementary.
Lancaster Elementary Scholarship	The Lancaster Elementary School Scholarship was transferred to HCCF at the closing of the school in 2018. It will provide a scholarship to a former Lancaster student annually until the 2018 Kindergarten class becomes the Senior Class of 2030, at which time all residual funds will be transferred to the Lucas Grube Memorial Scholarship Fund.
Larry & Janice Jordan Ryan Scholarship	In 2019, Huntington residents Larry and Janice Ryan established a scholarship to assist graduating seniors who reside in Huntington County, who have a GPA of 3.0 or higher.
Lucas Grube Memorial Scholarship	The Lucas Grube Memorial Scholarship was established in 2017 through the efforts of the Crestview Middle School Student Council, teachers, family, and friends of Lucas. While at Crestview he was active in Football, Wrestling, Band and Track. He was also on the Academic Super Bowl Team and received Kiwanis Boy of the Year. The recipients will be Huntington County graduating seniors who attended Crestview Middle School and participated on athletic and academic teams.
Luke & Erma Scheer Memorial Historical Scholarship	This scholarship was established in recognition of Luke J. Scheer and his lifelong interest in historical events having impact on the heritage of Huntington County and his efforts to acquire and preserve relevant property. The purpose of the Fund is to help further instill in others an appreciation of Huntington County history.
Margaret W. Russell Scholarship	This scholarship fund was created in 1994 through a donation from Margaret W. Russell to financially support Huntington County youth attending Huntington University.

Mark Douglas Fisher Scholarship	Huntington residents Doug and Tina Fisher established the scholarship in 2019 to honor their son Mark's memory. The scholarship provides financial assistance preferably to specific high school attending graduates, that have a strong motivation to complete further education and have a genuine love for baseball/softball.
Mary Edith Reiff Scholarship	This scholarship was established by Mary Edith Reiff through her Will to help outstanding students seeking further education. It is awarded to students living in Huntington, Andrews and/or Dallas Township.
Mary Elizabeth Goodale Moody Scholarship	The Mary Elizabeth Goodale Moody Scholarship was established to honor her memory, as well as her contributions to Huntington County. She graduated from Huntington College and taught school for 32 years, with a portion of those years teaching in Huntington.
Metro Kiwanis Wohlford Memorial Scholarship	In 2001, the Kiwanis Club of Huntington Metro., established the Metro Kiwanis Wohlford Memorial Scholarship Fund to honor Charles L. "Chuck" Wohlford. A lifelong resident of Huntington, Mr. Wohlford taught social studies at Huntington North High School and coached at several schools in the corporation. He was an accomplished historian and statistician for Huntington North athletics, as well as the author of "The History of Huntington County Basketball."
Miami Tool & Die Scholarship	Joy Conley established the Miami Tool & Die Scholarship in 2018 for the express purpose of assisting those Huntington County students interested in a career in the machine trades.
Murray Scholarship	The Murray Scholarship Fund was established to assist applicants who are pursuing a career in a vocational, technical, or skilled trade; or who are pursuing a career in cybersecurity, information technology, or another technology related career.
Northwest Elementary School Scholarship	The Northwest Elementary School Scholarship was transferred to HCCF at the closing of the school in 2018. It will provide a scholarship based on the "Northwest Way" to a former Northwest student annually until the 2018 Kindergarten class becomes the

	Senior Class of 2032, at which time it will provide scholarships to any Huntington County youth graduating from Huntington North.
Paul D. Souder Memorial Scholarship	Established by Paul's parents, David P. Souder and Jenny Dietz, and his brothers in memory of his love of flying and the field of aviation. The purpose of this fund is to help financially assist students pursuing a career in aviation.
Philip Rich Memorial Scholarship	Established by Phil's mother, Marilou Wardrop and friends of Phil, the Philip Rich Memorial Scholarship is designed to assist a deserving Huntington North male senior athlete with college expenses. In high school, Philip was an outstanding basketball player – setting school records and winning a regional title his senior year. In his free time, Phil was a coach's assistant and helped teach elementary school children basketball skills. Other interests included community service, he was involved in the Trinity United Methodist Church Youth Group and was Vice President of his senior class. He was also a member of the H Club, the Spanish Club, and the Football Team.
PNC Bank Scholarship	The PNC Bank Scholarship (formerly First National Bank of Huntington Scholarship) was established to assist students in pursuit of an education at Huntington University.
Pokey Memorial Scholarship	Pokey was born a clown in the mind of an 80-year-old retired teacher of the Huntington County Community School Corporation in 1993. Pokey spent her former life teaching, nurturing, and stimulating the imaginations of Huntington County students. Every student was encouraged to reach their maximum potential in education. It is that same spirit that has inspired the creation of this scholarship in her honor.
Roanoke Elementary School PTO Scholarship	The scholarship was established in 2019 by the Roanoke Elementary school PTO and is awarded to Huntington County residents who are graduating seniors of Huntington North High School that attended Roanoke Elementary school for a minimum of three years.

Rob Henn Athletic Scholarship	Family and friends who participated in the first annual golf outing in remembrance of Rob Henn established the Rob Henn Athletic Scholarship in 2008. An annual golf outing continues to support this scholarship. The scholarship is awarded to a student athlete from Huntington North who displays "unquestionable character, a high regard for teammates, and due respect for opponents."
Rob Mayo Memorial Scholarship	Established in 2014, the Rob Mayo Memorial Scholarship was created to preserve the memory of Rob Mayo, the beloved resident property manager of St. Felix Monastery.
Robert & Jean Gernand Family Scholarship	The scholarship was established in 2021 by Jean Gernand and is awarded to a Huntington County resident pursuing a major in education entering their sophomore or junior year of post- secondary education.
Robert E. Wilson Scholarship	The Robert E. Wilson Scholarship was established to financially assist applicants attending Huntington University on a full-time basis.
Robert M. "Bob" Straight Memorial Endowed Scholarships	The Robert M. "Bob" Straight Memorial Endowed Scholarship was endowed jointly by the James and Martha Seneff Foundation and the Douglas and Virginia Ware Foundation in 2020 in honor of their high school basketball coach, Bob Straight. Jim and Doug were teammates under Coach Straight on the 1964 Huntington High School basketball team which competed for the Indiana State Championship.
Scott Breiner Memorial Scholarship	Nancy and Jim Breiner established the Scott Breiner Memorial Scholarship in memory of their son, Scott. The purpose of this scholarship is to support and encourage students who wish to pursue further education. It is awarded to a Huntington North or Northfield High School graduate who plans to pursue an education major, although other majors will be considered.
Sheri Herr Memorial Scholarship	In August of 1997, Richard and Connie Herr, in loving memory of their daughter, established the Sheri Herr Memorial Scholarship. The scholarship assists worthy students with roots in Wells County in their pursuit of a higher education.

Shirley & George Kilander Purdue University Scholarship	Huntington residents Shirley and George Kilander established the scholarship in 2004 to provide financial assistance to graduating seniors attending Purdue University, West Lafayette, as full-time students. George graduated from Purdue with a degree in Engineering Technology.
Smallwood Willis Family Scholarship	Established in 2022, the Smallwood Willis Family Scholarship Fund was created to assist students who have been accepted into and attend an accredited post-secondary educational institution.
Stephanie Pyle Memorial Scholarship	The Stephanie Pyle Memorial Scholarship, established in 2016, honors the daughter of Anne and Dean Stonebraker. This scholarship is awarded to Huntington County residents attending Stephanie's alma mater, Huntington University, with a preference for those majoring in business or education.
Steve Platt Memorial Endowed Scholarship	The Steve Platt Endowed Scholarship was established in 2021 by the Platt and Ware families to honor his life and legacy. The scholarship is available to Huntington County residents who are graduating seniors from Huntington North High School and have earned a varsity letter in at least one Indiana High School Athletic Association (IHSAA) sport.
Sumner B. Sheets Memorial Scholarship	Sumner B. Sheets, a farmer in Huntington County, was also an avid hunter, traveling on many hunting and fishing expeditions. As such, he donated his entire wildlife collection to Huntington County. Applicants for this scholarship must be a Huntington County resident and be pursuing a career related to agriculture, animal sciences, or natural resources.
Thomas & Janet Uecker Memorial Scholarship	Applicants for the Thomas and Janet Uecker Memorial Scholarship. Thomas, a long-time HNHS math teacher and Jane, also a Math teacher in Indiana. The scholarships is directed toward graduating seniors pursuing a career in a Math-related field.
Thomas & Suzanne Seifferlein Scholarship	The Thomas & Suzanne Seifferlein Scholarship Fund was established by Chuck Homier and Ray Bigelow, lifelong friends and classmates who wanted to honor their former teacher and coach, Thomas (Tom) Seifferlein, and his late wife Suzanne, who

	passed away in 2021. Both Thomas and Suzanne taught through the Huntington County Community School Corporation; Thomas as an industrial arts instructor and Suzanne teaching elementary education.
Tiffany Albertson -	This fund was set up in memory of Tiffany, a long-term Huntington resident was known for her love of education and devout Catholic faith. Tiffany was the principal at Bishop Luers High School and then the assistant principal at Bishop Dwenger High School. She also taught chemistry and biology at Bishop Dwenger High School and Huntington North High School. Tiffany loved to travel and spend time with her family. She shared the love of Christ with everyone she encountered. The scholarship will be directed toward students pursing a career path in a science related field.
Tom Parsons Memorial Scholarship	The Tom Parsons Memorial Scholarship was established in 2022 by members of the Parsons family, as a way to honor Mr. Parsons' love and dedication for teaching American Literature at Huntington North High School for 30 years. The purpose of this scholarship is to assist and support graduating high school students who are pursuing a career path in English/Literature Education or English/Literature.
Vincent M. Allman Art Scholarship	The Vincent M. Allman Art Scholarship was established in 1998 by John and Debbie Allman in memory of their son. The purpose of the scholarship is to support and encourage students who want to pursue a career as an art teacher or in the area of visual art.
Wayne & Carolyn Jenks Athletic Scholarship	The scholarship was established in 2019 by Carolyn Jenks and her sons and is awarded to a graduating senior of Huntington North High School who has competed in athletics.
William & Elmyra Helm Scholarship	The William & Elmyra Helm Scholarship is awarded specifically to students who are attending Olivet Nazarene University located in Bourbonnais, Illinois.
William G & Ilo Jane (Altman) Martin Scholarship	This scholarship was set-up in 2023 through the last Will and testament of IIo Jane Martin in memory of her and her husband's deep rooted Christian faith. These funds will help students at any level who want to follow a career path in the Christian faith. They

owned and farmed 105 acres of land in Jackson Twp., Section 5, where they lived which they bought from Ilo's father who had farmed the land for many years before them.
